

the Parish Hall after the 7pm Mass.



June 21 is the Feast Day of St. Aloysius Gonzaga 1568-1591

Aloysius which is the Latin form of Louis, was born into a wealthy and powerful noble family in Northern Italy. He was the eldest of 7 children. Aloysius trained as a soldier from the age of 4 and was sent to Florence at the age of 8 for more education. He

became ill there with kidney disease. During that time, he spent a lot of time in prayer and reading about the Saints.

Aloysius decided at a young age that he wanted to become a Missionary and join a religious order. At the age of 17, he joined the Society of Jesus in Rome and was ordained a Deacon at the age of 20. He never did become a priest. In 1591 a plague broke out in Rome. Aloysius cared for the sick in a hospital set up by the Jesuits. He became ill himself with the plague and died on June 21, 1591, shortly after his 23rd Birthday.

He was beatified in 1605 and canonized in 1726.

St. Aloysius is the Patron Saint of youth, students, Jesuit novices, AIDS patients, AIDS caregivers, and sufferers of pestilence.

Gospel Reflection: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Weekend of June 18/19 - From the rich Eucharistic themes to be drawn from today's second reading, one

stewardship theme stands out: The Eucharist is Christ's gift to us. Good stewards are grateful for this gift and realize that no matter their station in life, they are welcome to come to the table and receive the body and blood of Christ. If Jesus could break bread with his betrayer, Judas, his denier, Peter, and the other ten who deserted him, then he will welcome us. Do we truly appreciate what a tremendous gift it is to approach the Lord's table? Do we realize that the Holy Spirit means to transform us by the gift of Christ's body and blood?

Gospel Reflection: Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Weekend of June 25/26 - Today's Gospel reveals to us the beginning of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. We will journey with Jesus for many Sundays to come, and along the way he will teach us about the demands of discipleship. His instructions may seem harsh and unreasonable to our ears. His response to legitimate requests to postpone the journey reminds us that there are always justifiable excuses to defer the journey or put off the responsibilities of discipleship. Other important matters compete for our attention. Some of us must make heart-wrenching choices, but there is urgency about Jesus' mission to bring forth God's kingdom. His demand is that we proclaim the Kingdom of God now. Is this our first priority, or do we have other priorities? *ICSC E-Bulletin June 2022*
