<u>MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS</u> • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE STUDENTS • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. During the academic year we have a student mass on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. that focuses on the pastoral needs of students. <u>SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION</u> • For more information about preparation and dates please visit our website or contact the parish office.

<u>MARRIAGE</u> • Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND SHUT-IN • Trained Volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, in nursing homes, in hospitals or in prison. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the parish church, Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

PARISH OUTREACH • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

MUSIC IN THE LITURGY • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.

Last Thursday, on December 10th, three St. Michael sponsored refugees arrived in our Region. The two young Syrian men joined their cousins here in Waterloo. Another young Syrian man (who arrived with only 5 days notice) is living with his cousins in Cambridge. It is expected that other arrivals are imminent and again with very short notice. The Social Justice Committee is busy

looking for suitable accommodation for a family of 6 (Mother, Grandparents and 3 children (ages 10, 13, 17) with the Father and older son hopefully joining them within a few months. If you know of anything suitable at a reasonable rent, or it you have any furniture/household items to donate or if you speak arabic and would be available (especially during day-time hours) to translate for this family, please call Diane at 519-616-2227. Thank you to everyone who has already donated household items. Several other refugee families from Syria and Iraq, sponsored by St. Michael's, have been cleared to come and although they are being welcomed by their families, furniture and household items for them would also be appreciated. Thank you.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Ride for Refuge last October. The money raised (\$1,758.25) will be used for the sponsorship of a family of 4 currently living in a refugee camp in Malawi.

Sister Gloria has returned safe and sound to Kenya full of gratitude for the warm and generous reception she received here in KW. She is already sending pictures of and letters from some of the Notre Dame Children Outreach students. Thank you especially to the new and renewing sponsors - so far \$49,627.00 is on its way to the SSND in Kenya. A big thank you also to those parishioners who gave to the general Mission donation. Those monies will also be on their way soon. Sister Gloria said that words cannot express how grateful the NDCO staff are for everything St. Michael's is doing for the children and that when she observed the parish's dedication to this project, it gives the NDCO staff encouragement and the motivation to work harder themselves.
