MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

<u>MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AND STAFF</u> • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. Each Sunday evening during the university academic year, we provide a parish Mass at 7:00 p.m. that focuses on the pastoral needs of students and staff of the universities and colleges in our community.

MARRIAGE • Couples intending to be married are asked to fill out the application form available at stmichaelw.ca/sacraments. Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND SHUT-IN • The Parish Nurse and trained volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, in nursing homes, in hospitals or in prison. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the parish church, Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

PARISH OUTREACH • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

<u>MUSIC IN THE LITURGY</u> • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.



TELEVISED CHRISTMAS MIDNIGHT MASS

This is the 60th year that CHCH-TV has televised the Midnight Mass which is broadcast live and then repeated at 8:00 a.m. on Christmas morning. A carol service will begin 11:30 followed at p.m. by Midnight Mass. The televising of this celebration is made possible by the Catholic Cemeteries of the Diocese of Hamilton.





50th Anniversary of First Mass in <u>St. Michael's Church</u>

50 years ago our church building was sufficiently completed for the community to celebrate its first Sunday Eucharist in the hall.

To mark this date there will be a sing-a-long (for 20 minutes) before all the masses on December 20/21 of songs that may have been sung at that first mass. Come early and join in "Memories in Song".

St. Louis Out of the Cold (OOTC) advisory team has made the decision to close down St. Louis OOTC effective Jan. 31, 2015, after 16 years of service. The Region's emergency shelters, specifically House of Friendship and the YWCA shelter are enabling the homeless to find permanent housing. St. Louis OOTC is confident the Region's efforts to end homelessness are working. We feel duplicating the services the Region is now supplying would not in the best interest of the homeless. Our goal is to support the Region with their mandate of aggressively addressing homelessness in the region.

Pope Francis to attend World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia – The Diocese of Hamilton is planning a trip to the World Meeting of Families, departing Sept. 22, 2015 and returning September 28, 2015 - both Bishop Crosby and Bishop Miehm will be attending. The World Meeting is designed to be significant to people of all ages at all stages of life. Every keynote address and workshop will be based on the concepts of marriage, family and relationship. This is a family event with workshop streams for those 18 and older, 6 - 12 years and day care for those 5 and younger. The first 100 people to register for the Hamilton Diocesan trip will have both their registration and transportation (by bus) paid by the Diocese, leaving only the cost of hotel and food. From the Parish Nurse:

With the joyous season of Advent and Christmas upon us, we can expect more people to attend our church services. These include our frail elderly, young parents with infants and young children, and those

of us in between – everyone in a confined space, and not all of us in peak health. All conditions point to an ideal time for bacterial and viral infections to spread very quickly. This can have fatal consequences for people with compromised health conditions, persons who take drugs for cancer treatment or who may be on powerful immune-suppressants, not to mention those people with compromised immune systems. So, what do we do?

Wash your hands thoroughly and frequently. Teach good personal hygiene to your children. Use the sanitizer at the church entrances. Keep a

sanitizer in your purse or pocket.





Cough and sneeze into a tissue or the crook of your elbow. Dispose of your tissue properly.

Avoid touching surfaces that come in contact with lots of people.

Nod, smile or bow rather than shake hands during the 'sign of peace.' Eucharistic ministers must cleanse hands well with sanitizer and are asked not to serve if unwell.

Stay at home when you are ill. Transfer of an illness may have severe or fatal consequences. This is "loving your neighbour" in action.

Get the flu shot. If you have concerns about the vaccine, talk with your family doctor who knows your medical history and can advise you, or Waterloo Region Public Health at www.regionofwaterloo.ca/ph

And a special note to our valued elders.....please be prudent and exercise good judgement when weather conditions are icy or stormy. A fractured bone is often the precursor to a dramatically changed health status and living arrangement.
