**PARISH RECORDS** • Our parish records are very important and we try to keep them as up to date as possible. Please advise the office if you change your address or telephone number.

**<u>MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS</u>** • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

**MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE STUDENTS** • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. During the academic year we have a student mass on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. that focuses on the pastoral needs of students. **<u>SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION</u>** • For more information about preparation and dates please visit our website or contact the parish office.

**<u>MARRIAGE</u>** • Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND SHUT-IN** • Trained Volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, in nursing homes, in hospitals or in prison. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the parish church, Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Village at University Gates, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

**PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL** • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

**PARISH OUTREACH** • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

**MUSIC IN THE LITURGY** • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.

# **Mass Intention Guidelines for** St. Michael's Parish

An important custom of the Church has always been to request the celebration of Masses for the repose of the souls of those who have passed away, and also for the intentions of our family and friends. This is an important and long-standing tradition in the spiritual life of the Church, and we encourage this devotion.

In order to accommodate as many requests for Masses as possible, effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017, St. Michael's Parish will be abiding by the following guidelines for Mass intention requests:

- Each parishioner may request up to six (6) single-Mass intentions per year for a particular intention
  - Parishioners wishing to request more than six (6) Mass intentions for a particular intention may do so by adding their request to one of our regularly scheduled multi-intention Masses (Tues. 7:00pm & Sat. 5:00pm)

In addition, we are able to accept as many Mass intentions as desired for 'unannounced' Masses - in other words, for Masses that will be celebrated but which won't appear in the bulletin. Typically such Mass intentions are sent to retired priests of the diocese who are happy to receive them. Mass cards can be issued for such Masses by St. Michael's, but a date won't be assigned.

It is a beautiful and sacred act to request the celebration of a Mass for another, and we are always happy to accept your Mass intentions during regular office hours!



All CWL ladies are asked to complete all the information required on CWL envelopes. Some ladies have moved and contact information has changed. If you have an e-
