# Solemnity of the Epiphany and Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

The Epiphany of our Lord is the Christian feast observed on January 6. In some countries it is celebrated on the Sunday after January 1st. The word epiphany comes from the Greek word epiphainen, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates that Christ has made Himself known to the world with the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12). The feast of the Baptism of the Lord commemorates the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist. On this occasion, Jesus entered into His ministry and acquired His first disciples; St. John proclaimed Christ the Lamb of God, whose way he had prepared, and the Triune nature of the Godhead was manifested. The Baptism of the Lord is usually celebrated on the first Sunday following the Solemnity of the Epiphany but in some calendar years like this year it is celebrated the Monday after.
