**<u>MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS</u>** • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

**MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE STUDENTS** • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. During the academic year we have a student mass on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. that focuses on the pastoral needs of students. **<u>SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION</u>** • For more information about preparation and dates please visit our website or contact the parish office.

**<u>MARRIAGE</u>** • Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND SHUT-IN** • Trained Volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, in nursing homes, in hospitals or in prison. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the parish church, Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Village at University Gates, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

**PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL** • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

**PARISH OUTREACH** • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

**MUSIC IN THE LITURGY** • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.

**St. Michael's Refugee Sponsorship** <u>Update:</u> Last weekend, our parish was introduced to Adnan, Siham, Lama, Assem, Lana and Taj. Thank you for welcoming them so warmly. They love Canada especially Waterloo and feel

very safe here. Two Iraqi families arrived on June 8th and are currently staying with their Canadian family members. Another Iraqi family arrives on July 13. Only two more Iraqi families are waiting to be processed and then all 13 Syrian and Iraqi families sponsored in 2015 through St. Michael's will be safe and sound in Canada. Awesome! Thank you to everyone who has donated goods to aid in the resettlement. Still needed are some dressers, a vacuum cleaner, a microwave, a smallish sofa bed, iron and ironing board, side tables for living room and bedroom. If you are unsure, please call Diane at 519-616-2227. Always welcome are gift cards for grocery stores. Resettlement is not an easy process - there is so much to learn, there is guilt and worry because other family members are living in danger, there is social isolation because of language, there are health issues, there is the change from being independent and in control to being dependent on the charity of others, so, please pray for all of our newcomers.
