MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE STUDENTS • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. During the academic year we have a student mass on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. that focuses on the pastoral needs of students. SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION • For more information about preparation and dates please visit our website or contact the parish office.

MARRIAGE • Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND SHUT-IN • Trained Volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, in nursing homes, in hospitals or in prison. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated in the parish church, Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Village at University Gates, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

<u>PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL</u> • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

PARISH OUTREACH • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

MUSIC IN THE LITURGY • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.

Parish Lenten Retreat with Fr. David Perrin

David B. Perrin, Ph.D. is a Roman Catholic priest and full-time professor at St. Jerome's University. He has been teaching Christian spirituality and ethics since 1995. He spent two years in Haiti and several years in parishes in northern Ontario prior to beginning his teaching ministry. He is the former President and Vice-Chancellor of St. Jerome's University, a past-President of the Society for the Study of Christian Spirituality, and was the Dean of the Faculty of Theology, St. Paul University, Ottawa. As a professional educator, academic speaker and author, as well as a popular workshop and retreat director, he has given conferences, workshops and retreats on a range of topics in Canada, the United States and Europe. He is the editor of *Women Christian Mystics* (2001), author of *For Love of the World* (1997), *The Sacrament of Reconciliation* (1998) and *Studying Christian Spirituality* (2007).

Father Perrin will preach the weekend of March 11 & 12 and will lead the retreat on the evenings of March 13, 14 & 15 with mass at <u>6:30pm</u> and the retreat at 7:00pm, about 30-40 minutes in length. Below is an outline of the topics:
