- Daily Mass and Lord's Day Masses celebrated in public are currently suspended due to the Covid-19 Health Precautions. The Public Celebration of the Stations of the Cross on Fridays and Adoration on Tuesday are suspended. Our Parish Website will update you on developments. All Public Activities in our Parish Centre, Church and Student Centre are suspended.
- At the request of the Bishop, our Parish Church is to be closed and confessions are by appointment only, and will be through use of the confessional screen if at all possible. Please remember social distancing if you are standing in line. The Sacrament of Reconciliation may always be celebrated in danger of death.
- At the request of the Bishop, hospital visitation is strictly limited, bringing communion to homes is restricted, and it is not possible to bring the Eucharist to Senior Residences and Nursing Homes. The Sacrament of the Sick may always be celebrated in danger of death.
- Daily Mass will be celebrated by Father Freitas for your intentions in the Our Lady of Fatima Chapel in our St John Paul Student Centre. It can be viewed on line via our new St Michael Parish You Tube Channel which you can access via our parish website – www.stmichaelw.ca
- Father Freitas will pray the Stations for your intentions and offer a Holy Hour on Tuesday privately in our Chapel for your intentions. The Rosary will also be recited daily by Father Freitas in our Chapel, and in time we hope to stream this on line also for all to participate in together.

The Parish Office remains open but may reduce hours moving forward. Please do not attend in person if you are not feeling well.

In light of the present situation unfolding before us regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19) worldwide, the difficult decision has been made by our Bishop to suspend the public celebration of Mass at this time. A copy of my Pastoral Letter, announcing this decision, can be found on our parish website. Our primary concern is the spiritual and physical wellbeing of the faithful and of all those who serve at our parish, recognizing that we also have a duty to care for the community at large and the most vulnerable among us.

Obviously this is disturbing. We join many of our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world who are deprived of the opportunity to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, for many reasons. Due to this health emergency, we also will now experience their suffering. Perhaps this sacrifice will help us to cherish more profoundly the great gift of the Holy Eucharist. There is no substitute for personally participating in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is the source and summit of our life in Christ, and we pray for the time when once more we will be together.

It is important to follow carefully the provisions of the health authorities, but it is also essential that our spiritual life be enhanced and strengthened all the more during this crisis. For this reason we must not succumb to "spiritual self- isolation" and so I encourage all to engage in prayer – to pray the Rosary, to read the Scriptures, to use the Bishop Barron books we made available at the start of Lent, and to offer prayers for all those who are suffering in this crisis. We should also pray for the health care workers and others who are engaged in fighting this pandemic on the frontlines.

I also encourage us to come together virtually. I will celebrate Mass for you daily from the Chapel of our St John Paul Student Centre and I invite you to be together with me virtually and to tell neighbours, friends and other parishioners and Catholics to join us so that we can be together. It will come live at 9:00am daily on our parish YouTube channel – which can be linked from our parish website - and be available for re broadcast throughout the day. In time we hope to add other devotions so that we can be united in prayer.

In these challenging days, we must also recognize the opportunity to be truly present to one another and to care for those who are struggling, alone or isolated. Call a neighbor, Skype with a friend, stay connected with family. These moments of uncertainty call each one of us to renew our commitment to prayer, fasting and almsgiving as part of our Lenten journey, amplified on a broader scale in light of current circumstances. May we continue to pray for all those infected with COVID-19, those caring for the sick and for one another.


