During Lent, we have the perfect opportunity to make a stop in our busy lives and think of where we are in our relationship with God. Maybe we can meet God with opening our heart to Him in the sacrament of Reconciliation. "Our encounter with God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation always begins with God seeking us. The guilt that we experience when we sin is God's merciful call to us, just as he called out to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden: "Where are you?" (Genesis 3:9) (Excerpt from Forgiven, a beautiful series about Reconciliation from the Augustine Institute you can watch with your free parish account on FORMED).

Laetare Sunday:

Today we are celebrating the Fourth Sunday of Lent, *Laetare* Sunday. Our joy in anticipation of celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord is so close that our Mother Church encourages her children with visible signs showing us that the time of penance and sadness is about to end and become a time for rejoicing and celebrating. *Laetare* comes from the Latin word for the command "*rejoice*", which is the first word in the introductory antiphon for today's Liturgy, (see, Isaiah 66:10). One of these visible signs is the rose vestments the priests wear on this very special Sunday. *Rejoice*!
