Holy Saturday 10:00 am – Blessing of Easter Food (Church) 8:00 pm – Solemn Easter Vigil (no 5 pm Mass or Confessions)

Easter Sunday Sunday, April 4 - 9 am and 11 am (11 am is also live streamed) No 7 pm Mass

This coming week truly is a Holy Week. We will celebrate the central mysteries of our Faith.

HOLY THURSDAY - we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. On this night, Our Lord instituted the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders. Holy Thursday marks the beginning of the Three Days or Triduum of prayer.

GOOD FRIDAY – we commemorate Christ's suffering and death on the Cross. The liturgy consists of three parts: the liturgy of the Word, the veneration of the Cross, and the reception of Holy Communion. This is the only day during the year when we do not celebrate the Eucharist.

EASTER VIGIL - is the most solemn memorial of the Liturgical Year. We keep watch and celebrate the Resurrection of Christ in the sacraments in four parts: the Service of Light, the Liturgy of the Word, Christian Initiation, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Easter Vigil does not correspond to the usual Saturday evening Mass.

On this night we will welcome *eleven* adults as full members of the Catholic Church.
