MASS INTENTIONS



We are beginning some remote preparations to ensure that our connection and preparation with them can continue.


GIVING TO OUR PARISH AT THIS CRITICAL TIME - ELECTRONIC GIVING -

To accomplish the mission entrusted to us by Christ, St. Michael Parish depends entirely on the generosity of our parishioners. With the suspension of Sunday Mass and our Holy Week Celebrations, we urgently need you, our faithful parishioners, to continue to support St. Michael Parish. I realize that this is a time of significant insecurity, financially and in other ways, for many people, but if you are able to continue your contribution to St. Michael Parish, you would allow us to pay salaries, keep the buildings heated and provide for our outreach ministries. There are four methods to make your offering:

- Pre Authorized Giving: through scheduled monthly or weekly transfers. Forms are available at on our website or by calling our parish office and we will send the forms to you. Fill out the form, attach a void cheque and place the form in a sealed envelope and put it in the parish office mailbox or scan both and email to parish@stmichaelw.ca
- Drop off your weekly envelope by putting it through the mail slot in the Parish Office door.
- Post-dated cheques. Instead of coming every week, put several post-dated cheques into the same envelope.
- Electronic Giving: Go on to the parish website and click *donate* and make your donation automatically using your credit or debit card on our secure page.
