**<u>NEW TO THE PARISH</u>** • Please come and introduce yourself and complete a registration form available on our website at www.stmichaelw.ca or on the hospitality desks at each entrance to the church.

<u>**PARISH RECORDS</u>** • Our parish records are very important and we try to keep them as up to date as possible. Please advise the office if you change your address or telephone number.</u>

**<u>MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS</u>** • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

**MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE STUDENTS** • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. During the academic year we celebrate a 7pm Sunday Mass for students. The St. John Paul II Student Centre (jp2waterloo.ca) offers programing throughout the week, and Campus Ministry at St. Jerome's University provides pastoral care and programming for students on the University of Waterloo campus (sju.ca).

**<u>BAPTISM</u>** • For more information about preparation and dates please visit our website or contact the parish office.

**<u>MARRIAGE</u>** • Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND** • Trained volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, long term care facilities or in hospitals. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated at Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Village at University Gates, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

**PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL** • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

**PARISH OUTREACH** • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

**<u>MUSIC IN THE LITURGY</u>** • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.

#### **Building Fund Collection**

You will notice a Building Fund envelope for next Sunday (Nov 11) in your envelope offering package. In

anticipation of that, we would like to ask for your continued support, and highlight the ongoing need. Most immediately, as you will have noticed over the last few weeks, it has been necessary to replace the deteriorating roof on the Hemlock St. side of the building. As the roof had been replaced in stages in the past, we anticipate the next big expense within 5-10 years will be replacement of the parking lot side of the roof. Bills for ongoing maintenance on our aging boiler continue to be a reality, as well as various 'wear and tear' expenses that regularly crop up. In addition, although we have made some progress on paying down the loan from our parking lot project of last year, our outstanding debt will be in the range of \$300,000 once the roof expense has been taken into account. Anything you can offer to assist with our building expenses will be greatly appreciated for our beloved-but-aging parish home!
