1) How do we live our missionary discipleship? In his book, **From Maintenance to Mission: Evangelization and the Revitalization of the Parish**, Robert Rivers (Paulist Press, 2005), urges parishes to focus our attention on mission to the world, rather than maintenance oriented (directed all our resources to people in church, p. 38). He also wants us to be active disciples, not simply consumers. This consumer attitude is based on a mentality where the goal of every good Catholic is getting to heaven: by being in church every Sunday, going to regular confession, avoiding grave sins. There is little concern for the baptismal call to share actively in the mission and ministry of Jesus as our way into the kingdom. The author continues, “as long as Catholics view baptism as an entitlement rather than a call to active discipleship, our parishes will continue to be fundamentally maintenance-oriented service stations that only take care of the needs of their own.” (p.39)– This is fruit for thought!



2) Exercising our missionary discipleship when it comes to baptism of infants: parishioners recognize that since baptism is the first and most important sacrament in one's life, it is vitally important for the Christian Community to be present, to give prayerful support to the parents and godparents, while welcoming them to continue to worship with us and celebrate their belonging in the faith community. For this reason, the Ritual of Baptism clearly endorses the practice of baptizing infants within the assembly gathered at Sunday Mass.

3) Liturgy Moment – Receiving the host consecrated during the Mass. During Mass, the liturgical action of the gathered community with the presiding priest, in prayer over the bread and wine to transform them into the Body and Blood of Christ, is a very important ritual action. In communion, we affirm that we are also conformed more to Christ when we receive his body and blood. As much as possible, we should receive communion from the host consecrated during the Mass, not from the left over host for the sick, taken from the tabernacle. Obviously we resort to using the hosts from the tabernacle out of necessity, because of the variation of Sunday attendance at any Mass. However, we need to get away from using the hosts in the tabernacle at the beginning of Communion during every Sunday Eucharist. This has already been clearly reinforced in the new liturgical directive. At our parish, this has been our practice for a while.

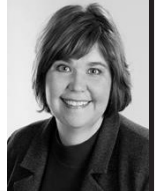

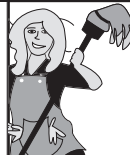
