### LENT BEGINS ON ASH WEDNESDAY,

March 6. Ash Wednesday is a universal day of fast and abstinence. Fasting binds all persons from 18-59 years, unless prevented by poor health. On days of fast,



one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids may be taken. Abstinence from meat binds all persons who are 14 and older, unless prevented by poor health. In the Archdiocese of Ottawa, the consumption of meat is not allowed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent. The Archbishop mandates this observance for the spiritual well-being of the faithful. The Way of the Cross will be prayed at 8:00am. We will add a 7pm Mass and ashes will be distributed at 9am, 4:30pm and 7pm. See the Pastor's column for more details.

**PAUPER SUPPER:** Please mark your calendar and join us at our annual Pauper Supper of bread and homemade soup

Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>, 5:00pm-7:00pm in the Parish Hall. Every year on Ash Wednesday the Ladies of Fatima brew up the best soup and serve it with plain bread and rolls to mark the start of our Lenten fasting season. This has become a parish favourite – a time to reflect

- 2) On Wednesday, March 6 we begin the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday, the day we come together as a parish family to refocus our attention on God and our baptism. What is Ash Wednesday all about? It is the time when we begin our journey to the great three-day festival of Jesus' death and resurrection, the celebration that is the heart and centre of the Church's liturgical year. We call this feast the Paschal or Easter Triduum (Triduum meaning a period of three days) or the Passover of the Lord. Morning Masses will be at 9:00am followed by 10:00am Liturgy of the Word with the children from Our Lady of Fatima School participating. Ashes will be imposed with Liturgy of the Word at 12:15pm at Dr. F. J. MacDonald School. We shall also have Mass with Our Lady of Perpetual Help Devotions at 4:30pm, as well as Mass at 7:00pm. All Masses will include imposition of ashes.
- 3) The readings of Ash Wednesday are a clarion call to assemble as a people, a solemn announcement that Lent is the favorable time of grace, a summons to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The words that accompany the imposition of ashes are a fine summary of our Lenten undertaking as a people: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel".
- 4) The collection is a liturgical act. It is taken up with the gifts. It is important that the significance of the collection as a sign of our self-offering be maintained. Therefore, **people who have arranged to give their regular offerings through the pre-authorized debit plan are asked to still use envelopes.** Simply mark 'PAD' on the envelope and deposit it in the collection basket. There is no need to put any amount, since that record is kept by the pre-authorized debit plan. This gesture will maintain the symbolic meaning of the offering.
- 5) As we begin the Season of Lent, it is good to reflect upon the Role of the Assembly: "As a member of the gathered assembly each of us has a role to play. We are called to take part with our whole mind, body and soul. We are also called to full, conscious and active participation. We arrive on time, prepared to praise, honour and give thanks to God. Aware that we are part of the body of Christ and not isolated individuals, we show hospitality to one another and are present throughout the liturgy. We sing with vigor, listen attentively to the proclamation of the Word and the priest's homily. We observe the moments of prayerful silence and we pray the prayers and responses to the liturgy with conviction. During the Eucharistic prayer we unite ourselves to the words and actions of the priest. We join in the communion procession and song and receive communion reverently. We do not leave until we are dismissed and our recessional song is completed. Then we remain if possible to visit with other members of the community. Then we go forth spiritually recharged to live our lives as followers of Christ."
- 6) Special thanks to Don Yantha who is stepping down as Coordinator of Hospitality Ministers after over 30 years of service. Don is indeed the face of hospitality at Fatima. Not to worry he will still serve as a hospitality minister at the 10am Mass. As of March 4<sup>th</sup> the new Coordinator is Debbie Allen.
