LIVING GOD'S COMMANDS

The first reading (July 14) forms part of Moses' farewell discourse, a call to the people to return to God. It is not a legalistic summons; rather, it is an appeal to heart and soul. It outlines a command that is not impossible to follow, or too difficult to undertake, or too expensive. Look into your hearts, says Moses; there you will find what to do.

Paul sees Jesus Christ as the image of God, the agent of creation and preservation. We sense, in his words, things profound: "dominions or principalities or powers." But in the midst of that, Paul keeps his attention on Jesus Christ, head of the church. It is in Christ that we find fullness and reconciliation—in the blood of the cross.

Luke's Gospel illustrates the double commandment of love with the story of the Good Samaritan. The story is a radical one, for it comes to focus on the question of who my "neighbor" is.

That neighbor is not identified with any group, but rather by the scope of our compassion.

Important Information from the Bishops Office

Re: **Ban of the BNP Movement (Banal Na Pag-aaral aka Holy Studies Group)**

This is an organization which originated in the Philippines and was banned by Bishop Sherlock and Bishop Grecco in our diocese on August 5, 1998. It is a movement aiming to recruit members of the Filipino community but is not limited to this ethnic community only.

It has been brought the Bishop's Fabbro's attention that, once again, efforts are being made to re-establish weekend retreats and devotional events in the Diocese of London, particularly in the Windsor and Essex deaneries.

The late Cardinal Jaime Sim, officially declared **BNP NOT CATHOLIC** on October 16, 1989.

Effective Immediately:

No BNP activities are permitted in any London Diocesan facility or institution that is in union with the Diocese (schools, hospitals, retreat centres, etc.)

No member of the clergy is permitted to participate in any activity sponsored by BNP including the celebration of sacraments.

Issued: June 21, 2013 by Bishop Ronald P Fabbro, Bishop of London.

JULY 14TH-GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 1:15-20

Jesus was a great storyteller. We can imagine how fascinating His voice and manner must have been when He told the parable of the Good Samaritan to the lawyer who wanted to be saved. And how surprised the lawyer must have been when he heard the answer to the question: "Who is my neighbour?" My neighbour is not just the person next door or a member of my parish or my racial group. My neighbour is anyone in need, even if he or she seems to be an enemy. Jesus' parable reveals the true meaning of love of neighbour. It is going out of our way to do everything for someone that we would want done for us.

Discussion Questions: *What is Jesus' message in this parable? If you truly understand His message, how could you carry it out in your neighbourhood or parish?*

JULY 21ST-GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 10:38-42

A guest shows up, probably unexpectedly, and the hostess Martha, knocks herself out trying to do everything at once. The guest, Jesus, sits down and makes Himself at home. The sister of the hostess, Mary, sits with Jesus, and listens thoughtfully. When Martha complains that she is doing all the work, Jesus tells her that she has forgotten the most important thing. She has neglected to listen to Jesus, whose words are more nourishing than any meal.

Discussion Questions: *How can we put more Mary-like listening into our lives? When do we make time to listen to our families, our friends? When do we make time to listen to Jesus?*
