

## **3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER**

#### GOSPEL REFLECTION John 20:19-31

The title of this wonderful story from John's Gospel might be "Surprise Picnic at the Beach." In a very human way, it shows the great love Jesus and His friends had for one another. While the disciples are out fishing, the risen Christ appears on the shore at Lake Tiberias. They are anchored at a distance and do not recognize Him. But when they follow His advice and wind up with a sagging net full of fish, John figures out that the stranger is Jesus. Coming ashore, they enjoy the picnic breakfast Jesus had prepared for them.

Although our reading stops after the meal itself, we know from the rest of the Gospel that Jesus called Peter aside after they ate. He asked Peter to "feed my lambs. Tend my sheep."

Discussion Questions: We share a special meal as Jesus' disciples today. It is the Eucharist.

We also recognize that Jesus calls us to care for others. How will you show your love to those who join in the celebration of the Eucharist with you?


