GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 24:35-48

This reading from Luke's Gospel could be called "The Ghost Story That Wasn't." Two disciples who had just met the risen Jesus on the road are telling their story to the other disciples. Then right in the middle of their story, Jesus appears and says, "Peace be with you." The frightened disciples think they are seeing a ghost. Jesus has to show them His wounds and even eat a piece of fish to prove that He is real. The good news is so good that the disciples find it hard to believe at first. Because they are still not sure what to make of Him, Jesus explains how He has fulfilled the Scriptures by His suffering, death and resurrection. In His name, they will go out to preach repentance and forgiveness of sins for all people.

Discussion Questions: *Recall a time when a friend or family member appeared "out of the blue" when he or she was not expected. How did you respond? What are some of the reasons you think the disciples had such a hard time believing that their unexpected visitor was really Jesus?*



SAINT OF THE DAY
"St. Adalbert of Prague"

Opposition to the Good News of Jesus didn't discourage Adalbert, who is now remembered with great honor in the Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary and Germany. At the age of 27 he was chosen as bishop of Prague. Those who resisted his program of clerical reform forced him into exile eight years later. In time, the people of Prague requested his return as their bishop, however he was exiled again after excommunicating those who violated the sanctuary by dragging a woman accused of adultery from a church and murdering her. He went to preach the Good News to people living near the Baltic Sea. He and two companions were martyred by pagan priests in the region. Comment: Preaching the Good News can be dangerous work whether the audience is baptized or not. Adalbert fearlessly preached Jesus' Gospel and received a martyr's crown for his efforts. Similar zeal has created modern martyrs in many places, especially Central and South America. Some of those martyrs grew up in areas once evangelized by Adalbert.
