HE IS RISEN!!

The Lenten journey is now complete; its mission of renewal and preparation to receive new life is fulfilled. The call to worship the Risen Lord has been received, and we gather to experience together the consoling presence of Christ in word and sacrament. We are at our best today, crowded and cramped to be sure, but the fullest sign of whom we were meant to be. Christ has claimed us in the waters of baptism, we have acquired wonderful companions, and together we can accomplish great things. This is the day for rekindling the old flames of baptismal commitment, so we light the paschal candle, and by its light we make yet again the ancient promise to reject evil's grip and empty promises. Today we do not recite the creed, but rather Renew our Baptismal Promises with hearty responses. We are taking the first joyful steps on a fifty-day-long celebration. In the Southern Hemisphere, the world is slipping into winter, but for us in Canada, the earth seems to sing hymns to Christ's victory. Look this morning for the fresh paschal candle situated in the sanctuary. It was consecrated in the hours of the night, will burn brightly for fifty days whenever we gather for prayer, and will glow again at every baptism and every funeral in the year ahead. Even though we may be gathered around the candle someday in sadness, today's victory over death will shine through.

BAPTISMAL PROMISES

The Church invites all Catholics on Easter Sunday to renew the promises that were made by them or for them at their Baptism. With these promises, we not only renew our willingness to reject evil and believe in our triune God, but also renew our commitment to be faithful disciples of Jesus, the Risen One. In the introduction, the Presider reminds us "we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to new life. " This invitation and expression of baptismal reality identified us with both the suffering Jesus and the risen Christ. The renewal of these promises is a renewal of our own efforts to live as servants so that others can experience the good and blessings God has in store for them. This is no rote ritual; it is a powerful expression of our willingness "to see and believe".

HAPPY EASTER

The Sign of Peace, (or kiss of peace) is an ancient practice, vouched for by none other than Saint Paul, who told the Romans "to greet one another with a holy kiss" (Romans 16:16). According to the earliest accounts, the peace was exchanged before the gifts procession, in remembrance of Christ's words "if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother or sister has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:23-24). But as early as the time of Saint Augustine, this sign had been moved to follow the Lord's Prayer. It becomes not only a prayer for peace, but also a sign of reconciliation and forgiveness, and a preparation for the reception of Holy Communion. The Sign of Peace gradually died out in the Middle Ages. The words remained but the gesture vanished: instead of exchanging a sign of peace with other members of the assembly, the priest kissed the altar again at this point of the Mass. The Sign of Peace was restored following the Second Vatican Council. The peace is a ritual moment: we speak to one another the words of the risen Christ. We exchange a gesture - whether a bow, a handshake, or a hug—which speaks of peace in a way words cannot. The peace is a ritual moment. It is not a secular greeting, a chance to say 'how are you?"......there is no need to greet everyone—simply those in our immediate vicinity.
