

GOSPEL REFLECTION John 10:11-18

When Jesus wanted to describe Himself, He did not compare Himself to a magnificent king or a powerful ruler. He said, "I am the good shepherd". And the people of His time knew immediately that He was speaking of a humble caretaker of the flock that depended on Him for survival. Some shepherds work only for pay and leave their sheep unprotected. The good shepherd lays down His life to save them. No one forces him to do so. He chooses to give His life for the sheep He knows by name and loves to the end. The Good

Shepherd looks forward to the day when all people will "be one flock". They will recognize His voice and be gathered into His fold.

Discussion Questions: How are the followers of Jesus called to "shepherd" others who may be lost or afraid, weak or without guidance?



SAINT OF THE DAY "St. Catherine of Sienna"

The value Catherine makes central in her short life was her complete surrender to Christ. At the age of 18 she entered the

Dominican Third Order and spent the next three years in seclusion, prayer and austerity. An active public

apostolate grew out of her contemplative life. Her letters, mostly for spiritual instruction began to take more note of public affairs. Opposition and slander resulted from her mixing fearlessly with the world and speaking as a person completely committed to Christ. She was cleared of all charges in 1374. Her public influence reached great heights because of her evident holiness and the deep impression she made on the Pope. She worked tirelessly against the Turks for peace between Florence and the Pope. Catherine ranks high among the mystics and spiritual writers of the Church. In 1939, she and Francis of Assisi were declared co-patrons of Italy. Paul

V1 named her and Teresa of Avila doctors of the Church in 1970. Her spiritual testament is found in *The Dialogue*.


