THE COSTS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today's responsorial psalm, Psalm 40, is more familiar to us with the refrain "Here am I, Lord." This "Here am I" is Jeremiah's great prophetic response to God's call. But today's story of Jeremiah and the refrain "Lord, come to my aid!" remind us that there are always two sides to following the call of God. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews knew this, too. He reminded his readers that even weighted down with burdens and sins, we can still persevere by keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, who himself knew the shame and pain of the cross, but saw beyond it to the joy of sitting at the right of the throne of God.

Jesus himself gave the disciples a "sneak preview" of a baptism that would not be as wondrous as the one in the Jordan that inaugurated his ministry, but would be one of fire and anguish. Today's words from scripture may not be terribly soothing, but in their honesty and strength we can acknowledge the difficulties of daily discipleship, and take comfort in the assurance of our own salvation in Christ.



ST. ANTHONY'S CHURCH ROOF REPAIRS

I am sure many of you have noticed the condition of our rectory, church and hall roofs. We have been losing shingles on a regular basis for many months, not just as a result of high winds but due to the age and dryness of the shingles. If you cannot see the missing shingles on the roof, just look on the ground around the property! The roofs are in desperate need of shingle replacing now before the Fall sets in.

Although all the roofs are in need of repair, I have already have had the rectory roof re-shingled in July. With the rectory undergoing extensive and expensive repairs prior to my arrival in 2007, I did not want water damage to cost us more for repairs. There has been an ongoing problem with the flat roof that has been repaired twice and although it was only a "patch job" it has been holding. The rectory was shingled at the cost of \$5,231.90. Water continues to come into the church when it rains, as it does in the church basement and hall- but that's another story.

Having received numerous quotes for the church and hall roofs, I have decided to go ahead and re-shingle the church and chapel area at this time, at the cost of \$44,296.00. This includes the installation of new plywood (\$11,074, and shingles \$33,222.) I am hoping that the diocese will grant me the permission to go ahead with the installation very soon before the weather changes.

That brings me to the topic of the old church hall, which houses the local community food bank for storage and distribution of foods upstairs and the kitchen in the hall basement. I have informed the food bank workers that they must find another venue for their storage and distribution. The condition of the upstairs is a liability issue with the ceiling tiles falling and water coming in over the whole roof, not to mention the presence of mold and mustiness. With the rain coming in it seeps through the floor and makes its way into the basement, along with the water seeping in from the walls and floor of the basement which happens every rain.

We would not only be looking at an additional cost of \$27,007 to replace the hall shingles but also to do repairs, correct the drainage problems and do all the refurbishing-this would no doubt be a costly undertaking.

I am not convinced that this expense would be financially feasible considering the limited use that hall experiences on a yearly basis.

Our parish attendance and finances have been decreasing steadily over the past years and so have our weekly collections. With less income and rising costs, we have to be honest in the direction we will take. Just bringing you up to date.


