

This Wednesday, February 22nd, begins the season of Lent. Other than Christmas and Easter, there is no time when our churches are more filled. There is just something about Ash Wednesday that can touch the hearts and consciences of people **Haster's Besk** who seldom go to church. The Lenten season is a time of reconciliation: God's reconciliation with a wounded who seldom go to church.

world, but also a time for us to be reconciled with God again. This, hopefully, does-

n't mean that we have left the church or even sinned seriously. But it is a time for us to come to the Lord with a sense of repentance for our failings—great or small. And that is why we have the gift of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It gives us an opportunity to do something externally to reflect what is going on in our hearts.

Jesus gave us this sacrament for that very purpose. There was no one who knew more about the human personality that Jesus. When he said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you" (John 14:27), Jesus was speaking to His apostles huddled in the upper room, scared to death for their lives. They had failed Jesus, running from His side when He faced His passion. It was one thing to heal the sick and cast out demons. But when the chips were down, they folded like houses of cards.

Jesus came to them not with scolding or blame. "Peace" is what he said—and He meant it. They had to have despised themselves when they came face-to-face with their cowardice. That's not what Jesus wanted them to feel. He wanted them to experience reconciliation with themselves. "Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven." Strange, isn't it, how the weakest of Jesus' followers are told to carry the forgiveness they have received to the whole world?

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not about beating ourselves up. God is not about blame. God is about forgiveness and new life.

When was the last time you celebrated Christ's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Do you keep "putting it off" for fear or embarrassment or perhaps feel you have no need for His love and mercy? Ask the Lord to fill your heart with a child-like trust so that you will be able to approach Him and experience the peace that only He can give you. As in the past two years, the Diocese of London has set aside a full day where every parish will offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the day. On Wednesday, March 21, 2012, the opportunity to celebrate the sacrament will be available at St. Anthony's and St. John's. I ask you to watch the bulletin in the upcoming weeks for the scheduled times.

More information and aids (examination of conscience, prayers, etc.) will be offered to help you prepare. Let us pray for one another as we begin this wonderful season and ask that the Lord bring healing and peace to all those who seek it.
