WATCHING FOR THE MESSIAH

Today's Gospel story of John and his disciples seeing and following Jesus sounds so simple and casual, it's easy to miss the significant acts of faith that are made.

John points to Jesus: "Look," he says, "there is the Lamb of God." John's faith in Jesus is evident, so evident that John's disciples immediately leave his side to follow this Jesus.

The two disciples make their own act of faith. They follow Jesus, spend time with him, and are quick to spread the good news of their discovery: "We have found the Messiah."

It is easy to forget that the expectations of generations, the hopes of many ages of faithful people were being fulfilled in these simple acts of faith. The Lamb of God, the Messiah, foretold by the prophets, had finally come. Nearly everyone among the Jewish people was watching for the Messiah back then; who in our own society watches for signs of the presence of the Messiah today?

From Bishop Fabbro: As you will recall, in preparation for the 2014 Extraordinary Synod on the Family, the Holy See provided a series of survey questions and invited a broad-based consultation. These questions were posted on the Diocese of London website in December of 2013. In response to this invitation, more than 340 participants completed the questionnaire or some part of it.

In preparation for the 2015 Ordinary Synod of Bishops on "The Vocation and the Mission of the Family in the Church and in the Contemporary World", the Holy See is once again seeking the input of the whole Church.

To this end, the Canadian Bishops are providing a series of survey questions that have been adapted for use in Canada. The consultation is seeking reflections on the reality in each diocese and concrete suggestions and best practices for pastoral action.

I invite all parish leaders, Priests, Deacons, Lay Ecclesial Ministers and Parish Pastoral Council members, parents and those who assist families on their journey: teachers, principals, family counsellors and social workers as well as all parishioners, to complete this survey, which will be available online on the Diocese of London website, www.dol.ca, **from January 16 to February 15, 2015**. For those wishing to complete the survey in French, please visit the website of the Canadian Bishops at www.cccb.ca.

Reflecting on what he called the "key word" in the liturgy during this time of the year, Pope Francis said Jesus 'manifests' himself at the Epiphany, at the Baptism, at the Wedding of Cana, but he asked:



"how can we know God?" Francis explained that this truth is explained less by the intellect than by the heart.

WE GET TO KNOW GOD ON THE PATH OF LOVE
"God is love! It is only on the path of love that you can know God. 'Reasonable love', 'love accompanied by reason'. But love! And how can we love what we do not know? Love your neighbors". This, the Pope said, is the doctrine of two Commandments: the most important is 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself'. And he pointed out that "to get to the first we must ascend the steps of the second: that means that through our love for our neighbor we can get to know God, who is love. Only through loving can we reach love".

That's why, Pope Francis said, we have to love each other, because love comes from God and whoever loves has been generated by God:

"God's love always awaits us; it always takes us by surprise. Our Father who loves us so much is always ready to forgive us. Always! Not once, always!"

Pope Francis concluded asking the Lord to give us the grace to be acquainted and to get to know God on the path of love.
