THIRD ADDITION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

On November 27, 2011, the First Sunday of Advent, we will be implementing the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. Over the next months we will be offering information about the changes called for by this third edition. However, this is an ideal time to learn more about the meaning of the Mass, the Eucharist, and to reflect on the meaning of our actions, song and prayer. This is the time to learn why silence is beneficial; what it means to be united at the table of the Word and the table of the Eucharist how Christ becomes present to us in Word, Sacrament, assembly and presbyter; how Jesus sends us into the world.

To help us make a good transition, **each Sunday from July 3rd to November 13th a bulletin insert will be provided with a reflection question or action.**

Every parishioner will receive the same information on the same weekend, so that we may grow together through the changes.

We encourage families and/or groups of friends to enjoy some conversation about the bulletin information. Together as a Diocese we will become more attuned to the great gift we celebrate, the Eucharist.

GOSPEL REFLECTION-July 10

Matthew 13:1-23

The parable of the sower is one Jesus' best known stories. It is filled with word-pictures that can take root in our memories. We can see the sower, or the farmer, tossing handfuls of seed left and right. And when Jesus describes the four different kinds of soil that the seed falls on, we can compare ourselves to one of those categories. How sad it is that so much of the seed does not bear fruit. Yet the word of God does not return to God empty. There will always be enough people of "good soil" to see and hear and do the work of God. The reign of God will come!

Discussion Questions: Do you know any "good soil" people? Describe one or two whom you know. What kind of soil do you think you are? Will you be ready today to let the word of God grow in your heart?

GOSPEL REFLECTION-July 17

Matthew 13:24-43

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus is determined that His disciples will understand how the kingdom grows in our midst. So he tells the parable of the weeds in the wheat field. The sower (Jesus) allows both the wheat (those who work for God's kingdom) and the weeds (those who work against God's kingdom) to grow together until the harvest (the end of time).

The Gospel tells us much about the justice and mercy of God. Even though the weeds are present in our world, the wheat is growing and will prosper in the end. The grace of Christ will triumph over sin and evil. **Pray:** Help me Lord to be your faithful follower until your kingdom comes in its fullness. Amen.

Discussion Questions: If you look carefully, you might find some "weeds" inside your own heart. What is Jesus' attitude toward them? How will you deal with them?
