

SPIRITUAL CATARACTS

1 Corinthians 13:12: Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. I know myself, but only in part. I know my spouse and children, and I know my parents-but only in part. I often look at the world through spiritual cataracts, my eyes dinged by worldly things. In my eyes, I may think that I'm more than I am. Others may think more or less. But, in God's eyes we are seen as we are. In His eyes we find understanding, grace, and compassion, for He knows us in truth. We want to look at others through God's eyes. But our understanding is only in part. The grace we extend, the compassion we feel, and the truth we see-they are all only in part. We do well to remember Phillippians 2:3,...in humility consider others better than yourselves. And as we encounter people throughout the day, perhaps we will find in Christ what we need to see others (and ourselves) through His eyes—eyes not clouded by speculation, prejudgment, or selfishness.

EUTHANASIA AND ASSISTED SUICIDE TIME TO STAND UP AND SPEAK OUT!

On June 15, a British Columbia Supreme Court judge declared Canada's laws against physician-assisted suicide unconstitutional because they discriminate against the physically disabled. If this ruling stands up to an appeal, Canada will be in the company of the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg and Switzerland as countries that permit physician-assisted suicide. Who is most threatened? Those who are sick, aged, those with disabilities and who are suffering from depression. The solution is palliative care until natural death. It is a question of public safety, dignity, true compassion and solidarity. What can I do? GOSPEL REFLECTION

Mark 6:30-34

If you have ever had the frustrating experience of being interrupted while you were trying to tell about some wonderful adventure, you will understand how the apostles feel in this Gospel. They have just returned from their first missionary journey. They want to tell Jesus about it. He leads them off to a quiet place where they can tell their stories. But the crowds follow them because they are hungry for Jesus' teaching and His healing touch.

Seeing the crowd, Jesus is moved to respond to them. They are like sheep that have been scattered. Out of love, the Good Shepherd calls them together and guides them. The apostles' adventure stories will have to wait.

Discussion Questions: What can we learn from the example of Jesus in this Gospel? How will you try to follow that example in your daily life?

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Summer

John 6:1-15

When large crowds gather, exciting and unexpected things can happen. That's the way it was when Jesus went up on a mountain shortly before the Passover feast. He had no idea that a crowd of five thousand would soon gather around Him. They were determined to hear Him speak and to see what great signs He might work. Unlike His disciples, Jesus was not concerned about how this huge crowd was to be fed on a few loaves and fishes. In familiar actions we recognize, Jesus took the bread, broke it, blessed it and gave it to His guest. When the crowd realized! that everyone had been fed and there were still leftovers, they were astounded. They wanted to carry Jesus off on their shoulders and make Him their King. Discussion Questions: Look back at the story. How does it encourage you to act when you feel that you have little to offer to those in

need?
