

GOSPEL REFLECTION Mark 4:26-34

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus presents two images for the Kingdom of God. One is the seed which is scattered on the land. But the one who scattered the seed does nothing further to ensure growth; yet it grows. The second image is the mustard seed which is tiny but somehow it becomes the largest plant with room in its branches for the birds to find shade. The Kingdom of God is never what we might expect; it does not follow "the rules" that society may have. People who live by Kingdom values do not follow society's ways. We are to be countercultural as Jesus was; embracing the outcast, proclaiming God's love for all, offering healing and reconciliation. And always we are given the grace to act as His disciples.

Discussion Questions: What do you think Jesus wanted to teach the disciples about the Kingdom of God? Which of the two images speaks best to you? How would you explain the Kingdom of God to someone who asks about it?

DON'T TAKE A VACATION FROM YOUR SUNDAY OBLIGATION

Summer is finally here, so let the vacation planning begin! Airline tickets: check. Hotel and rental car reservations: check. Bags packed and ready to go: check. Catholic church selected near our destination: huh? Part of the fun of traveling is the opportunity to visit new parishes. Vacations should be fun and relaxing but it's important to remember that our Sunday Mass obligation doesn't disappear because we're not in our home parish. According to the Cathechism of the Catholic Church, "The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (eg. Illness). Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin." (CCC21) No matter how remote the location there's usually at least one Catholic church within 10 miles. It's important that our children know that Sunday Mass is not optional and we can stress the importance of keeping the third commandment. This summer add "find a church" to your vacation planning checklist.
