GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 9:11b-17

Have you noticed how all the readings today speak of feeding people? The Gospel shows Jesus and the Twelve surrounded by a huge, hungry crowd. When the Twelve protest that they can't feed everyone, Jesus has them divide the crowd into smaller groups. Then He **takes** five loaves, two fishes-**gives thanks** (blesses the food), **breaks** it, and invites the disciples to pass it around and **share** it. There is more than enough for everyone! We can, of course, see this story as a sign of the Eucharist, in which Jesus continues to feed the multitude of His followers. But can we also see it as a challenge to do what we can to feed the millions of hungry people in our world today.

Discussion Questions: How can we match up our willingness to share food with the hungry with our willingness to share Jesus in the Eucharist?

FEAST OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

We need to remember that the Blessed Sacrament is most worthy of our attention, reverence and love, and worthy of *mental and spiritual preparation and discipline*. In order to receive the Eucharist in a spirit of great gratitude we can ask ourselves the following questions:

Am I full of negative feelings towards others? Am I too busy complaining about the traffic, the music, the crowd or lack of attendance to be open to Jesus' love?

Is my mind elsewhere? Am I so focused on the problems at work or home that I fail to open myself to the one who has the answer? Am I using the time I should be praying at Mass to chat with others? Am I thinking about the game this afternoon or the movie I saw last night? Is it any wonder we get so little out of Communion? We are called to be a Eucharistic people. Jesus wanted to be at the center of our lives. Let's resolve to celebrate this Feast in a spirit of reparation for our past offences against the Eucharist and in a spirit of great gratitude for this sublime gift.

If we get into the habit of examining and improving our participation in the Eucharist on this feast-and all Masses-we will be filled with every grace and blessing.
