



JUNE 30th-GOSPEL REFLECTION Luke 9:51-62

Jesus is on His way to Jerusalem. He is preparing Himself to face suffering and death. He forgives the Samaritans who refuse to welcome Him, showing His disciples how to behave toward their enemies. He then responds to three different people who want to follow Him. Does He say, "Come with me and all will be well?" Not at all. Jesus tells them right up front that the cost of becoming His disciple is high. That cost may include giving up home, family, and means of income.

Discussion Questions: When are you tempted to "look back" (perhaps at your sins and failings) or to look around in a different direction? Who or what helps you to keep trusting Jesus? How can you show that you are "fit" for the reign of God?

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The pilgrim experience of going by foot to the shrine of St. James, reaches its high point a month from now at the feast of the Apostle. Tens of thousands of pilgrims are already on the road. Typically they cover twelve to twenty miles a day. The difficult journey is made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. In the middle ages some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road although full of danger. Today, some people take up the route for exercise but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage; a long walk through a beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's valleys.



JULY 7th-GOSPEL REFLECTION Luke 10:1-12

If Jesus sounds like He means business in this reading, He does! What matters most to Him in the whole world is to make people understand that the reign of God is at hand. This is why He sends His disciples out in every direction. The harvest (people who have not heard the good news of the gospel) is ready right now. Jesus instructs the disciples to go quickly and travel light. They are to spread His peace, cure the sick, and proclaim the reign of God. *Discussion Questions: At this time Jesus had seventy-two disciples. How many does He have today? Imagine for a moment that Jesus sent you and a partner into your town to proclaim God's kingdom. How would you do it? What would you do first? Is there a way you could do this very thing in reality?*
