

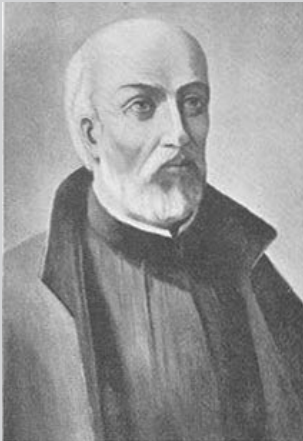

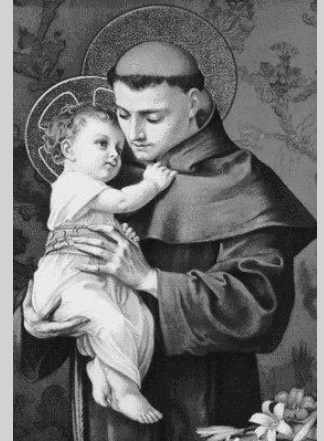

Dear Fr. Rick and parishioners,

As you know I had the honor to visit the Pope on last April 17 and I concelebrated with him during the daily morning mass at Santa Marta. While walking down Via della Conciliazione, on my way to the Vatican, I could see step after every step the beauty and the majesty of the basilica and almost feel, entering into St. Peter's square, myself self embraced by the two colonnades built by Bernini and that surround the Square. The two colonnades are made of 284 columns in rows of four and they give the impression of protection and outreach. On one hand, for their beauty and elegance they seem to represent the tender arms of the mother church who embraces her children to protect and feed them, on the other, for their measures and majesty they seem to recall the Father of the prodigal son or of the Good Shepherd who reaches out to find and recover who is lost and attacked by the "wolves". After Mass, I had the chance to greet Pope Francis

and after trying to explain, in a very short amount of time, the missionary work done in Haiti by Fr. Rick with NPH and the St. Luke Foundation, I told him about the violent assaults that several religious communities have received in the past six months and that is when the unexpected happened: I found myself embraced and the sensation was indescribable. I surprisingly was embraced by him! I felt the arms of the Good Shepherd who was giving comfort, hope and strength not to me but to all those who are praying, working and suffering to spread the Good News. I was speechless after that and he said: pray for me! On my way back I walked through St. Peter's Square again and looking at the colonnades I could feel his hug again and I promised to do everything I can so that this unexpected hug will be extended to all those I will meet along the way of life by opening my little arms especially towards those who least expect it. And I extend his embrace to you all for your testimony of faith and kindness. I enjoyed very much my days spent with you during the parish mission and I am heartily thankful for your generosity that will certainly help us extend our arms to those most in need.

Thank you and may the Passion of Jesus Christ be always in our hearts.
