

GOSPEL REFLECTION John 10:1-10

We are all familiar with the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. But in this reading from John's Gospel, Jesus first refers to Himself as "the gate" through which the sheep come to safety. The thieves are those people who try to enter God's kingdom by some other gate. The sheep are those who recognize Jesus as the only door to the green pasture of eternal an abundant life.

Discussion Questions: Think about what an ordinary gate does. It keeps safe whatever is in the yard and keeps out what might be harmful. How is Jesus a gate for your life? How does He keep you safe? How can you help others to recognize Jesus as the gate for their lives?
