GOSPEL REFLECTION

John 20-26

Once again we are reliving Easter night with Jesus and the disciples. He breathes on them, communicating the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They gladly receive Jesus' Spirit and His ministry of forgiving sins. At Pentecost the Spirit will send them forth as living signs that Jesus has overcome sin and death.

Discussion Questions: *Forgiveness is not "forgiving and forgetting." It doesn't deny that a wrong or a hurt took place. When we hurt someone, the bridge between us falls down. Our bond with that person is broken. When we forgive someone, or are forgiven, we allow the Holy Spirit to rebuild the bridge between us, even stronger than before. When we forgive, we bring God's love into our lives and into the lives of those who have hurt us. Are there any broken bridges in your life? What might be a first step to the Spirit's gift of rebuilding and repair? How could you ask the Holy Spirit for help?*

WHAT IS PENTECOST ALL ABOUT?



This Sunday, Christians across the world will celebrate Pentecost. In fact, not all Christians recognize this holiday (holy day). But it is generally honored in liturgical churches (Roman Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, Eastern Orthodox, in Pentecostal and Charismatic churches and in many other Protestant churches as well. Pentecost is not as well-known or as popular as Christmas and Easter, though it commemorates a watershed event in Christian history. In many ways, Pentecost is the birthday of the church. For Christians, Pentecost is a holiday when we commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost, a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could meaningfully be called "the church". From a historical point of view, Pentecost is the day which the church started. This is also true from a spiritual perspective, since the Spirit brings the church into existence and enlivens it. Thus Pentecost is the church's birthday.
