GOSPEL REFLECTION

Mark 12: 41-44

This reading contrasts the actions of the Jewish High Priest with Jesus' priestly office. Each year the Jewish high priest entered the sanctuary of the Temple of Jerusalem with the sacrifice of animals' blood. In contrast, Jesus entered the sanctuary of heaven and offered the sacrifice of Himself once to take away our sins. During today's liturgy, let us ask especially for the forgiveness of our sins, especially for not being generous in forgiving one another.

Discussion Questions: *Why is this reading a source of hope for the followers of Jesus? This reading points us toward the end of time, when Jesus will come again. Sometimes people wonder when this will be and try to predict it through various events like earthquakes. Jesus has told us that we cannot know ahead of time, and this reading does not tell us when Jesus will come. It does tell us why Jesus will come again and this is what is most important.*
