#### From Father Rick:

We have a growing problem in regards to our extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to our Nursing Home Residents and our Homebound. With ministers off on sick leave, away for the winter months, others requesting to be scheduled at only certain times and to particular nursing homes, (not to the homebound) and those asking to be removed from the schedule, you can (cannot) imagine the difficulty in scheduling.

We have come to the point where those who are ministering will have to be scheduled every two (2) weeks, which is a recipe for burnout.

What to do? Do we reduce the visits to twice a month OR do we again invite and mandate new ministers?

I have said this before; it is a rather sad situation when we accept to volunteer to be of service and then place restrictions upon our service.

It is understandable when emergencies and holiday time arise, we deal with that as best we can, but when we are shrinking in numbers, and we attempt to satisfy everyone's particular requests, it is those to whom we minister that suffer in the end.

# From the Office of Bishop Fabbro, CS Diocese of London's St. Peter's Seminary to undergo \$30 million renovation:

The historic St. Peter's Seminary building in London, Ontario will undergo complete renovation, with the support of a \$23 million contribution by the Diocese of Hamilton.

Bishop Ronald Fabbro, CSB, Bishop of London, is pleased to announce St. Peter's Seminary will undergo a full modernization and restoration, with the help of a contribution of \$23 million from the Diocese of Hamilton, under the leadership of Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI. A total investment of \$30 million will allow the Seminary to continue its mission in its present building. This revitalization of the Seminary building will enable the Seminary to realize its full potential as a leading house of formation for those men and women preparing for ministry in the Catholic Church in Canada. It will also strengthen the successful partnership with King's University College.

The balance of funding for renovations will come from already raised funds, the proposed sale of surplus property at the Seminary to King's University College, and a future fundraising campaign.

The renovations will upgrade much of the dated and inefficient interior, including 60 seminarian rooms, as well as new faculty suites, offices, classrooms, and common spaces. In addition, the exterior stonewalls and slate roof will be restored, and modern heating and cooling systems will reduce the Seminary's carbon footprint.

In its current state, St. Peter's has been challenged with the high cost of maintaining and operating its main building, first opened in 1926. As the Seminary with the broadest representation of seminarians from across Canada, it is clear that the vitality of St. Peter's Seminary is important not only to the Diocese of London, but to dioceses across Canada.
