If you, or a family member, are going to be in one of the hospitals in Windsor (Windsor Regional which is the Ouellette Ave campus and Metropolitan location); the Tayfour campus- Prince Rd.) or in Leamington District Hospital and would like a pastoral visit, please give the parish office a call and let us know. It is important that you indicate which hospital you are in so we can go to the right hospital. It is also of help to inform the admitting staff that you are Roman Catholic and indicate the name of your parish. When the pastoral care team of the hospital make their rounds and they see you are from the parish, they will make a visit and ask if you would like to receive Holy Communion. On numerous occasions I have made visits to the hospitals only to later learn that a parishioner had been a patient but I did not see them as their name was not on the RC list. By informing the parish office that you are in a particular hospital saves me from running around the city checking patient lists- only to learn that there is no one registered from the parish. You also need to be aware of the Privacy of Infor-

rou also need to be aware of the Privacy of Information Act. Information operators at each of the hospitals, by law, are not permitted to give out information regarding the patient. The same is true of the parish staff. If you want the name of a family member or loved one included in the Prayers of the Faithful, we must have permission from a family member or the patient him/her self.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 18:1-8

Just as our first reading was a victory story, so is the parable Jesus tells us about the widow and the judge. A lowly widow comes before a judge, seeking her rights. The immoral judge ignores her, but the widow goes on pleading and nagging until he finally decides the case in her favor. He helps the widow not because she is good but because she is persistent. Jesus concludes that if a corrupt judge can do justice to someone who keeps on asking, God, the most just judge of all, will certainly listen to those who persist in prayer.

Discussion Questions: Jesus Himself provides a discussion question for this Gospel: "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" What do you think? How will you try to be one of these faithful ones?

THE POT OF PRAYER

I will go to the altar of God, to God who is my joy and happiness. Psalm 43:4

Let's say a stress stirrer comes your way. The doctor decides you need an operation. She detects a lump and thinks it best that you have it removed. So there you are, walking out of her office. You've just been handed this cup of anxiety. What are you going to do with it? You can place it in one of two pots. You can dump your bad news in the vat of worry and pull out the spoon. Turn on the fire. Stew on it. Stir it. Mope for a while. Brood for a time. Won't be long before you'll have a delightful pot of pessimism. How bout a different idea? The pot of prayer. Before the door of the doctor's office closes, give the problem to God. "I receive your lordship. Nothing comes to me that hasn't passed through you." In addition, stir in a healthy helping of gratitude.

Your part is prayer and gratitude. God's part? Peace and protection.
