

OUR NEW SAINT

Feast day: July 14, Patron of the environment and ecology 1656-April 17, 1680 Beatified by: Pope John Paul 11-1980 Canonized by: Pope Benedict XV1-2012

Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin, canonized today (October 21, 2012) in Rome. Kateri was born near the town of Auriesville, New York in 1656, the daughter of a Mohawk warrior. She was four years old when her mother died of smallpox. The disease also attacked Kateri and transfigured her face. She was adopted by her two aunts and an uncle. Kateri became converted as a teenager. She was baptized at the age of twenty and incurred the great hostility of her tribe. Although she had to suffer greatly for her Faith, she remained firm in it. Kateri went to the new Christian colony of Indians in Canada. Here she lived a life dedicated to prayer, penitential practices, and care for the sick and aged. Every morning, even in bitterest winter, she stood before the chapel door until it opened at four and remained there until after the last Mass. She was devoted to the Eucharist and to Jesus Crucified. She died on April 17, 1680 at the age of twenty-four. She is known as the "Lily of the Mohawks". Devotion to Kateri is responsible for establishing Native American ministries in Catholic Churches all over the United States and Canada. Kateri was declared venerable by the Catholic Church in 1943 and she was beatified in 1980. Hundreds of thousands have visited shrines to Kateri erected at both St. Francis Xavier and Caughnawaga and at her birth place at Auriesville, New York. Pilgrimages at these sites continue today. Her feast day is July 14. She is the patroness of the environment and ecology as is St. Francis of Assisi.

INFORMATION ON BILL 13

On October 10th, Education Minister Laurel Broten said that Ontario's "anti-bullying" legislation, Bill 12, also means that Catholic schools <u>should not be teaching that</u> <u>abortion is wrong</u>, because it is "misogyny." Cardinal Collins has stated that the Catholic identity of the schools is "recognized and protected both by section 93 of our Canadian constitution—for without recognition of that identity the agreement that created Canada would not have proceeded—but also by section 1 of the Education Act of Ontario." *It is essential that Christians write the minister and explain that the Catholic school system, and Christian families, firmly believe in defending the most innocent of human lives in Canada, the unborn.* Please respectfully contact:
