

A FUTURE NOT OUR OWN

It helps now and then to step back and take the long view. The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us. No statement says that all could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith, no confession brings perfection...no set of goals and objectives includes everything. That is what we are about: we plant seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects beyond our capabilities. We cannot do everything and there is a sense of liberation realizing that. This enables us to do something and do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for God's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results...we are prophets of a future not our own.

Archbishop Oscar Romero of El Savodor, is the author of this poem. He was assassinated for speaking up for God's kingdom and justice in 1980.

GOSPEL REFLECTION Matthew 22:34-40

When you heard the Pharisee's question to Jesus, did you know what the answer would be? If not, now would be a good time to learn the answer by heart. Which is the greatest commandment? Jesus quotes the law of love in two parts. First we must love God with our entire selves. Out of that love of God grows the love of others. We must love our neighbours with as much care and concern as we have for ourselves. Does it seem very easy to love? As we try to do it, we will find it can be very difficult.

Discussion Questions: Why do you think most people say that this is the most important teaching of Jesus. How does this sum up the ten commandments and other teachings of Jesus? Who are our neighbours? What does "as yourself" mean?
