NOVEMBER, MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

All Souls' Day (Nov. 2) is a Roman Catholic day of remembrance for friends and loved ones who have died. This comes from the ancient Pagan Festival of the Dead, which celebrated the Pagan belief that the souls of the dead would return for a meal with the family. Candles in the window would guide the soul's back home, and another place was set at the table. The day purposely follows All Saints' Day in order to shift the focus from those in heaven to those in purgatory. It is celebrated with Masses and festivities in honour of the dead. While the Feast of All Saints is a day to remember the glories of Heaven and those there, the Feast of All Soul's reminds us of our obligation to live holy lives and that there will be purification of the souls of those destined for heaven. Upon death, it is believed that souls have not yet been cleansed of sin. Praying for souls of loved ones helps to remove the stain of sin, and allow the souls to enter the kingdom of heaven. Through prayer and good works, living members of the Church may help their departed family and friends. All Souls' Day is a time when families fondly remember their deceased loved ones. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, may perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.
