

27th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

GOSPEL REFLECTION Luke 17:5-10

The two sayings of Jesus in today's Gospel make us wonder about the other side of the story. When the apostles ask, "Increase our faith," are they secretly quite satisfied with their record of faithfulness? Jesus tells them that if they really have faith they can tell a tree what to do, and it will do it! The story about the servant tells us that Jesus' disciples should be grateful to God. When we do God's will, we should not expect to receive a gold medal. WE have, after all, done no more than "what we were obliged to do."

Discussion Questions: What is your attitude toward the next good thing asked of you? Is it to stand around and quibble about it? Or do you say, "I'll get it! I'll do it! I'm on it!" All Jesus asks is that we love one another, not that we just stand around talking about loving one another! Pray together: Lord, increase our faith and trust in you. May our faith and trust move us to action, not just talk. Amen.

The rosary is the most familiar of devotions, but nowadays many people think its sentimental, repetitive, boring. It is assumed to be part of the oldfashioned church furniture that has to be discarded.

In fact, the rosary is simply a summary of the mysteries of redemption, from the message of the angel at the beginning to the final glory of the saints in heaven and we think about these mysteries with Mary to help us. After all, it is only because Jesus Christ took human flesh of Mary that we can hope for heaven at all. It is because Mary said "Yes" to the angels' greeting that we can say, with her Son, "Our Father."

People sometimes find formal methods of prayer a hindrance rather than a help. They want to be able to pray to God without stiff structures that confine their freedom. But the method of the rosary, which is of course not the only method, provides us, when we are distracted or tired, with something to hold on to.

The words we use are God's words, the mysteries we remember are the very foundation of our faith and even the familiar feel of the beads as they slip through our fingers can remind us that we aren't angels. We need the help of material things, for God has made them, too, a way of holiness, part of the total giving of ourselves, body and soul to God. We live in the present but we remember the past and look to a future still to come. As we pray, here and now for ourselves, for those we love, for our enemies, we remember that it is the prayer of Jesus Christ Himself in which we share. Somehow, mysteriously, all that He did for us-in dying on the cross for us, in rising from the dead for us, goes on being done for us. That is what the Mass tells us; that is what the mysteries of the rosary tell us.

Since the month of October is dedicated, at least in part, to the Rosary, we are invited to honor Our Lady of the Rosary by its daily use.
