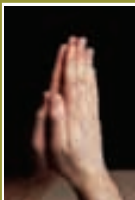

IS IT LOVING? When defining what love is not, Paul put rudeness on the list. "It is not rude." The Greek word for rude means shameful or disgraceful behavior. An example of rudeness was recently taken before the courts in Minnesota. A man fell out of his canoe and lost his temper. Though the river was lined with vacationing families, he polluted the air with obscenities. Some of those families sued him. He said, "I have my rights." God calls us to a higher more noble concern. Not "What are my rights?" but "What is loving?" Do you have the right to dominate a conversation? Yes, but is it loving to do so? Is it within your rights to bark at the clerk or snap at the kids? Yes. But is it loving to act this way?

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 15:1-32

It's celebration time! The lost sheep have been found. The lost coin has been located. Jesus tells these two "lost and found" parables to show us how delighted God is when a sinner is welcomed home. Notice that God does not just "sit around" waiting and hoping that the sinner will show up. God goes out like a shepherd seeking that one lost lamb, like a woman seeking that one special coin. Then God says, "Rejoice with me! A sinner has repented."

Discussion Questions: *He always knows where we are! But sometimes it seems we "lose" God. We forget about Him. We forget that we are valuable to Him. What happens to us and to our lives when we forget our value as children of God? What happens when we forget that all other people are valuable to God too? One way to celebrate our value to God is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.*

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

How prayer shawls work...the person knitting the shawl, prays while they knit.. It's wonderful if it can be done in a group of 2 or more people. Many times during the group, people offer up prayers or they pray several prayers together during the knitting. In the end, the shawls are collected and distributed to the homebound and those we bring communion to. In essence, the shawls, if we have enough, could be distributed to people at our Nursing homes, homebound and those who are sick in hospital.
