



Chrism Mass – The 9am Masses scheduled on Mon, March 25th and Tues, March 26th have been cancelled. Our Priests' will be away attending the Chrism Mass and Dinner in Hamilton. The 7pm Mass on Tues, March 26th will be celebrated as scheduled.

Office Closure - The Parish Office will be closed on Good Friday, March 29th.

The Sacred Triduum - Sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is known as the *Easter Triduum*, or *Sacred Triduum*, or *Paschal Triduum*.

Triduum is a Latin word meaning a "three-day day". It's one great festival following the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down His life in atonement for our sins. It's our greatest feast, the reason we even have a Christmas.

By the calendar they are three days, liturgically they are one 72-hour day — unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery". Each component "day" is from sunset to sunset, the Jewish way of marking time. For us that means, Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, and Mass of the Resurrection. Please join us during this holy time.

Reconciliation – To be reconciled with the Lord and one's neighbour is an integral part of our faith. We are



urged to confess our sins at least once a year. If you wish to meet with a priest for Reconciliation, just a reminder that a priest is available 30 minutes before all Masses. You can also make an appointment during the week. Additionally, there will be extra time set

aside for Reconciliation during Holy Week.

Lenten Resource - Are you are looking for a good Lenten resource to support your Lenten journey? "The Art of Living" by Edward Sri is available for \$10, while supplies last. A great read for anyone wanting to take the next step in growing towards God. Please call the
