WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - every eye shall see him.

All Catholics are obliged to abstain from eating meat on Good Friday. Let us unite our efforts at these penances with the passion of the Lord who died so that we might live. The paschal fast continues Holy Saturday.

SISTERS OF ST. JOSEPH – 170 YEARS IN HAMILTON!

On Tuesday, April 19, 2022, His Excellency Bishop Crosby, will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at Holy Rosary Parish, Burlington with the Sisters of St. Joseph. This year marks the 170th anniversary of the arrival of the first Sisters in Hamilton to care for orphaned and immigrant children. Then, as now, they lived in the heart of the city, not separating themselves from those whom they came to serve. Saint Mary's Orphanage, and later Mount St. Joseph operated for nearly 100 years. Sisters of St. Joseph contributed in a major way to the Catholic educational system in the Diocese of Hamilton. Their first hospital began in Guelph in 1861. Dundas saw the establishment of the *House of Providence* (forerunner of St. Joseph Villa) in 1879 and in 1890 St. Joseph Hospital was established in the City of Hamilton. Missionary work at home and abroad was another major contribution of the Sisters. They ministered in Guatemala, Jamaica, Zambia as well as with First Nations Peoples in Canada.

In 2012, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Hamilton amalgamated with Congregations in London, Peterborough and Pembroke to become the *Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Canada*. Today these Sisters continue their work among refugees, women in crisis, families in poverty, homeless persons in need of food, and teaching meditation to children in schools. Sisters work as parish administrators, parish ministers and chaplains. They are concerned with today's issues including the environment and care of the earth, work for truth and reconciliation, countering racism and homophobia. They continue to be a neighbour to those whom they encounter.

PAPAL APOLOGY

On Friday, April 1st after meeting with representatives of Indigenous Peoples at the Vatican, the Holy Father, Pope Francis offered an apology – together with the Canadian Bishops – for the involvement of Catholics in the government run residential school system. He also pledged to visit Canada to personally meet with Indigenous Peoples. The Papal apology is an important step in the ongoing process of reconciliation between the Catholic Church and Indigenous Peoples. Let us pray that it will continue to bear fruit in the days ahead.

Pope Francis said,

Listening to your voices, I was able to enter into and be deeply grieved by the stories of the suffering, hardship, discrimination and various forms of abuse that some of you experienced, particularly in the residential schools. It is chilling to think of determined efforts to instil a sense of inferiority, to rob people of their cultural identity, to sever their roots, and to consider all the personal and social effects that this continues to entail: unresolved traumas that have become intergenerational traumas.

All this has made me feel two things very strongly: indignation and shame. Indignation, because it is not right to accept evil and, even worse, to grow accustomed to evil, as if it were an inevitable part of the historical process. No! Without real indignation, without historical memory and without a commitment to learning from past mistakes,

problems remain unresolved and keep coming back. We can see this these days in the case of war. The memory of the past must never be sacrificed at the altar of alleged progress.

I also feel shame. I have said this to you and now I say it again. I feel shame - sorrow and shame - for the role that a number of Catholics, particularly those with educational responsibilities, have had in all these things that wounded you, in the abuses you suffered and in the lack of respect shown for your identity, your culture and even your spiritual values. All these things are contrary to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For the deplorable conduct of those members of the Catholic Church, I ask for God's forgiveness and I want to say to you with all my heart: I am very sorry. And I join my brothers, the Canadian bishops, in asking your pardon. Clearly, the content of the faith cannot be transmitted in a way contrary to the faith itself: Jesus taught us to welcome, love, serve and not judge; it is a frightening thing when, precisely in the name of the faith, counterwitness is rendered to the Gospel.

Your experiences have made me ponder anew those evertimely questions that the Creator addresses to mankind in the first pages of the Bible. After the first sin, he asks: "Where are you?" (Gen 3:9). Then, a few pages later, he asks another question, inseparable from the first: "Where is your brother?" (Gen 4:9). Where are you? Where is your brother? These are questions we should never stop asking. They are the essential questions raised by our conscience, lest we ever forget that we are here on this earth as guardians of the sacredness of life, and thus guardians of our brothers and sisters, and of all brother peoples.




