

The Most Reverend D. DOUGLAS CROSBY, OMI, DD *Bishop of Hamilton*

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

NEW MONSIGNORI

Pope Francis has appointed four priests of Hamilton Diocese as *Chaplains of His Holiness* with the title of *Monsignor*. Among these is Monsignor Raymond Modeski who was Rector of the

Cathedral from 1979 until 1992. The other priests named are Monsignor Earl Talbot, Monsignor Dan Hinsperger, and Monsignor Roger Formosi. The celebration of these honours will take place at the Cathedral Basilica in June. According to new procedures instituted by Pope Francis, priests who have completed their 65th year may be recommended by their Bishop for this honour in view of their distinguished service to the local church.
