WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

FROM THE RECTOR ...



PASCHAL FAST

Good Friday is a *day of fasting and abstinence* for Catholics. Those who are 14 years old to those who have completed their 59th year (and are in good health) are required to fast. This might mean that instead of three full meals – one reduces their intake of food to one or two meals for the day. The meals may be very simple. All Catholics are obliged to abstain from eating meat on Good Friday. Let us unite our efforts at these penances with the passion of the Lord who died so that we might live. The *paschal fast* continues on Holy Saturday.
