

The Most Reverend D. DOUGLAS CROSBY, OMI, DD *Bishop of Hamilton*

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

PARKING

Please note that the parking spots near the Tower entrance are *reserved* during our Saturday & Sunday Masses for persons with physical disabilities. Once those spots are taken we ask people not to park in the entry ways or sidewalks as this hinders the ability of folks to reach their vehicles and could also make it difficult for EMS responders to enter the Cathedral in an emergency. Also, please lock your car and remove any valuables — wallets, purses, cell phones, computers, loose change — most come to the Cathedral to pray ... some come to prey.

Summer series ...

The Order of Mass

The Sunday celebration of the Eucharist is meant to be the most important hour of our Christian week. At this celebration we encounter the Risen Lord in one another, in the priest, in the Word proclaimed in the Church, and in the bread and wine that become His Body and Blood. The Sunday Eucharist has a pattern and order that we call ritual. We all have certain set routines or disciplines to help us get ready in the morning, at work or at home. Often we perform these rituals without much thought ... they help us to set about the task at hand. Ritual prayer is something like that. We have a set pattern for how the liturgy unfolds, not so that we can mindlessly go through the ritual, rather so that we can free our minds and hearts for an encounter with the Risen Lord. The ritual of the Eucharist is very simple: we Gather, we Listen, we Break the Bread, we are Sent Forth.

It is Christ the Lord who **gathers** us. We attend the Sunday Eucharist at His invitation and by His grace we make our way to the House of the Church. It is Christ who draws us together for the Sunday Eucharist – each from our own daily concerns and burdens. We are called to unite with our sisters and brothers in song, prayer, and action as we offer our worship and praise to God. The *gathering* includes the processional hymn, the Sign of the Cross and Greeting, the Penitential Act, the Gloria (except Advent & Lent) and the Collect (or opening prayer) which *collects* all our prayers into one.

The gathered community now **listens** to the Word of God proclaimed. Often we hear passages from the Old Testament and the New Testament. Our listening is an *active* listening. We should not just follow along in the missal, but really hear the Word and allow it sink into our hearts and minds. We stand for the proclamation of the Gospel and listen for the breaking open of the Word in the homily. We have listened, and now we respond by reciting the profession of faith and offering the universal prayer for the church and the world.

Having been nourished at the Table of the Word, we shift now to the Table of the Eucharist. Simple gifts of bread and wine are presented and prepared on the Table. The presiding priest gives voice to the Church's prayer as we invoke the power of the Holy Spirit and the words of the Lord himself. In this prayer these simple elements become the Body and Blood of Christ – food for our journey. After praying the Lord's Prayer and offering the sign of peace, we join our fellow Catholics in the procession to the Altar to receive Holy Communion.

Our celebration concludes very simply. The presiding priest prays the Prayer after Communion and offers the blessing. He then invites us to go forth – nourished by Word and Sacrament – to be a leaven for the world. The recessional hymn is a custom in our part of the world, it is not required and can be replaced with instrumental music or silence.

WEEKLY ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Please note that we have weekly Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on **Saturdays** from 3:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. Join us as we pray for vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life; and for peace in our world.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITATION OF ADULTS

Any unbaptized adults who wish to become members of the Catholic Church are invited to speak with Father Wynen by contacting the Parish Office. Adults baptized in other Christian churches or baptized Catholics who have not been Confirmed may also wish to speak with Father about completing their Initiation. Our process begins in September.
