

The Most Reverend D. DOUGLAS CROSBY, OMI, DD *Bishop of Hamilton*

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

RECTOR'S MESSAGE

I am delighted to off you and your families the very best wishes of God's blessings at the beginning of this New Year. On behalf of Bishop Crosby and our Parish Staff, I pray that the coming year will help all of us move more deeply into Communion with the Lord and one another.

This past year has been an eventful one for our parish community. On February 25th, 2013 our Cathedral was designated a "Basilica" by Pope Benedict XVI. This designation fulfills the vision of Bishop John T. McNally who oversaw the construction of the Cathedral and opened it on December 19, 1933. An honorific title like this recognizes the significance of this Cathedral Church in our Diocese, in our City and the wider community.

In June 2013 our beloved former Rector, Monsignor Edward House, began his new assignment as Pastor of Holy Rosary Parish, Burlington. As a community we are thankful for Monsignor's twelve year ministry at the Cathedral which saw many improvements to the buildings and much growth in the social and spiritual aspects of the parish.

For me coming back to the Cathedral has been like coming home. I am very appreciative of the very kind welcome I have received and the many expressions of support. As a parish community we are called to be a place of welcome and hospitality and those qualities are certainly in evidence at the Cathedral Basilica in tangible ways.

I am also very grateful for the kindness and support of Bishop Crosby. His generosity and priestly hospitality are an example to be imitated. I look forward to an ongoing collaboration with him in the pastoral and administrative role that I have as Rector.

In the past year we have welcomed 32 children into the Catholic Church through the waters of Baptism. Two children and four adults received Our Lord in Holy Communion for the first time. Thirteen couples were joined in the Sacrament of Marriage. We said farewell to nineteen parishioners through the Rites of Christian burial.
