#### **WELCOME!**

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - every eye shall see him.

#### Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023

Mass with the Imposition of Ashes will be celebrated at **12:00 Noon** and **7:00 p.m.** in the Cathedral Basilica.

#### **Stations of the Cross**

Traditional Lenten devotion marks the 14 steps (stations) taken by Christ on the road to Calvary. **Fridays** in Lent at **7:00 p.m.** 

### **Daily Mass in Lent**

Tuesday through Friday at **12:00 Noon** in the Cathedral Basilica.

#### DISCIPLINE OF LENT

The *Season of Lent* is an annual opportunity to respond to the Lord's call to conversion of heart. We look at our lives with the light of God's mercy and seek to align our hearts and lives with Christ. Traditionally, Catholics have used three forms of discipline to help them focus on the call to conversion. This is a guide to those disciplines which might be helpful for you to consider as Lent approaches.

#### **Prayer**

The very best way to get to know a friend is to regularly speak with them. The same is true in our friendship with the Lord – it requires regular conversation. There are many forms of prayer – the Liturgy of the Church, personal prayer, reflection with Sacred Scripture, meditation and contemplation, formal prayers – the Rosary, morning/evening offerings, Acts of Faith, Hope & Love. A good thing to do as Lent approaches is to make a plan for daily prayer … remember it's not a matter of how many prayers or how much time, but rather prayer is a matter of communing with God who desires to draw us to Himself. The Sunday Liturgy is the *source & summit* of our life of prayer. It is from the Sunday Mass that we are inspired to pray each day of the week and to the Sunday Liturgy that we bring our prayers and intentions. In Lent, the *Stations of the Cross* provide a beautiful meditation on Christ's sacrifice of love for us … and our call to imitate Him in loving others.

#### **Fasting**

When we think Lent, we often think of what we'll "give up" for Lent. We fast from those things we enjoy so that we can discipline our desires. The physical hunger or longing as a result of fasting reminds of our deep desire for God's love and mercy. *Fridays* in Lent are days of fasting and abstaining from meat. Some people – who are in good health – may choose to have one main meal on Fridays. Or, they may choose to have simpler meals through the day. Abstaining from meat can be a way for us to be in solidarity with the majority of people in our world who know the reality of hunger. Catholics are required to *fast* and *abstain from meat* on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The rules of fasting are simple: the law of abstaining from meat binds Catholics who are 14 years of age and older; the law of fasting binds those who are 18 to 59 years of age (and in good health). Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on Fridays in Lent.

#### **Almsgiving**

Opportunities for charity abound. We might consider supporting some local charity, or the ShareLent campaign, with a monetary offering. Symbolically it might be \$1/day of Lent (\$40), or the offering may come from the savings of giving up meat on Fridays, or alcohol and other treats during Lent. Our small efforts can have a big impact for others and can help us experience solidarity with the poor.
