WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

COVID NEWS

The official position of the Catholic Church is that all available COVID vaccines are ethical and all Catholics who are able are encouraged to receive the vaccine. All employees serving in the Diocese of Hamilton are encouraged to be fully vaccinated or to submit to a COVID rapid test every Monday and Thursday to carry out their responsibilities. Volunteer liturgical ministers are required to be fully vaccinated. Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI, encourages every member of the Catholic Church within our Diocese of Hamilton to be fully vaccinated.

ONGOING PRECAUTIONS

The COVID pandemic presents us with new challenges as we move into the new year, please note the following:

- We are required to maintain 6 feet (2 meters) of social distance. The Cathedral is not yet able to open to full capacity.
- Masks must always be worn inside the Cathedral Basilica and McNally Hall. The mask should completely cover the mouth and nose.
- If you have a flu or cold please do not attend Mass until you are recovered.

Our Diocesan policy specifies that if the Priest tests positive he must isolate for 5 days (if vaccinated) or 10 days (if unvaccinated). During the isolation period the Parish Church and Parish Office will be closed. This may involve the cancellation of Sunday Masses. We will endeavour to share this information, if necessary, through our Parish website and on the outgoing telephone message. Our Priests (and Bishop) here at the Cathedral Basilica are fully vaccinated and remain vigilant for symptoms or illness.

RECTORY OFFICE

In an effort to limit the number of visits to the Parish Office during this latest COVID surge, kindly telephone or email <u>basilica@hamiltondiocese.com</u> with requests for certificates, Mass cards, or other documents. These will be prepared and left in our Rectory mailbox for pick up. Masks are to be worn during any visit to the Parish Office. At the present time, most appointments may be handled via Zoom or Facetime.

WEDDINGS

We are receiving requests for the celebration of Holy Matrimony for 2023. The ongoing COVID pandemic continues cause to uncertainty for those planning weddings. We'll hold off accepting 2023 weddings until May 2022. This will allow 2022 couples first choice of dates should they wish to reschedule. The Cathedral Basilica requires one year's notice of marriage. Couples who are free of any prior bond of marriage, with at least one Catholic in the couple, and who are resident in the Diocese of Hamilton, may request the Sacrament here. Couples who are not parishioners and are not supporting the Cathedral with time, talent, and treasure, are asked for a donation to support the upkeep of Marriage preparation is the Cathedral. provided and is required of all couples. Given the ongoing issues with COVID, couples should endeavour to keep things simple in terms of the number of people in the wedding party and the number of guests invited to the ceremony.

PASTORAL REFERENCES

Pastoral references for teacher applicants, and those applying for other positions with Catholic School Boards, are willingly offered for *registered parishioners* who are *involved* in the life of our Parish and who actively *support the Parish* through their **time**, **talent** and **treasure**. The Pastoral Reference is the Pastor's recommendation to the Catholic School Board that the applicant is not only a Catholic, but also someone whose active faith will be a positive influence in our school communities.
