WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

BISHOP CROSBY'S 25th Anniversary

Congratulations to His Excellency, Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI as he celebrates the 25th Anniversary of his Ordination as a Bishop. On January 2, 1998 – the Feast of the Epiphany that year – he was ordained Bishop of Labrador City-Schefferville. In 2003 he was appointed the Bishop of St. George's, Newfoundland while remaining Bishop

of Labrador City-Schefferville. A process of uniting the two Dioceses was initiated and on May 31, 2007 he was named Bishop of Corner Brook and Labrador. On November 8, 2010 Bishop Crosby was installed the Bishop of Hamilton. In addition to his Diocesan responsibilities, the Bishop has served on ICEL (International Commission for English in the Liturgy), various other committees of Provincial and National Conferences of Bishops. He has served as co-Treasurer, Vice-President and President of the Canadian Conference of Bishops. At his installation in November 2010, Bishop Crosby said, "I want gratitude to mark my time as Bishop of Hamilton." On this milestone anniversary, we all express our gratitude to God for the gift of Bishop Crosby and his ministry in the Church. May God continue to bless you and grant you health, joy and peace for years to come. Ad multos annos!

POPE FRANCIS MESSAGE FOR THE WORLD Day of Prayer for Peace 2023

Pope Francis' complete message for the 56th World Day of Prayer for Peace (January 1) can found on the Vatican website be vaticannews.va - in his message he reflects on the impact of the COVID 19 pandemic. The Pope concludes, "... we are called to confront the challenges of our world in a spirit of responsibility and compassion. We must revisit the issue of ensuring public health for all. We must promote actions that enhance peace and put an end to the conflicts and wars that continue to spawn poverty and death. We urgently need to join in caring for our common home and in implementing clear and effective measures to combat climate change. We need to battle the virus of inequality and to ensure food and dignified labour for all, supporting those who lack even a minimum wage and find themselves in great difficulty. The scandal of entire peoples starving remains an open wound. We also need to develop suitable welcoming and integrating policies for migrants and those whom our societies discard. Only by responding generously to these situations, with an altruism inspired by God's infinite and merciful love, will we be able to build a new world and contribute to the extension of his kingdom, which is a kingdom of love, justice and peace."

CHRISTMAS FEASTS

As the Christmas Season continues, we look forward to the celebration of the Epiphany of the Lord and the Baptism of the Lord. The feast of the Epiphany in Canada is celebrated on the Sunday nearest January 6th - this year Sunday, January 8th. This allows more of the faithful to be present for the celebrations of the manifestation of Christ as the light of the nations. Epiphany recalls the visit of the magi, the foreigners who followed the light of the star and found Jesus, Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem. There they presented gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Epiphany invites us to reflect on our own journey, guided by the light of Christ, and the gifts that we bring in return for his goodness to us.

This year, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord is observed on Monday, January 9 because Christmas fell on a Sunday. The Baptism of the Lord recalls Jesus' baptism in the Jordan by John the Baptist. The waters made holy by the one who was baptized. This moment is recognized as the start of his public ministry. Rising out of the waters, the Father's voice is heard, "this is my Son, the Beloved, listen to him." May this feast inspire us to listen for the voice of the Beloved in his word proclaimed in Church, in the Eucharist and in our service of one another in love.
