

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

To arrange for a Mass Intention to be remembered in this way please contact the Parish Office. Masses that cannot be fulfilled here are sent to the Missions.

CATHOLIC FUNERALS

Celebrating the rites associated with funerals are an important part of the grieving process for those who mourn the death of a relative or friend. In the Catholic Church there are three usual *Rites* associated with funerals:

The *Vigil for the Deceased* is often celebrated during one of the visitation periods at the Funeral Home. The Vigil is a celebration of readings and prayers that assist those mourning the dead.

A *Funeral Mass* may be celebrated in the parish church during which the gathered community listens to the consoling Word of God, shares in the Eucharist, and prays for the deceased. Usually the body of the deceased is present for the Funeral Mass, however it is possible to celebrate the Funeral Mass in the presence of cremated remains.

The *Rite Committal* takes place in a cemetery on the occasion of the burial of the deceased's body or cremated remains.

It is important to clearly specify your wishes and desires about your funeral arrangements.

The Catholic Cemeteries of the Diocese of Hamilton offer helpful planning tools for both funerals and burial. If you want to plan your readings and other aspects of the celebration you may contact the Parish Office for assistance.

Please also consider remembering the Cathedral Basilica in your Will.
