The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

CELEBRATIONS OF CONFIRMATION

The Cathedral Basilica was to host some Confirmation celebrations in the month of February – these have been rescheduled for early June.

ASH WEDNESDAY

We hope that our churches will be open for Ash Wednesday – depending on Provincial restrictions being lifted by that time. The *Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments* has specified that in light of COVID concerns, Ashes are to be imposed by sprinkling them upon the head rather than tracing a cross on the recipient's forehead.

COUNTDOWN TO LENT

The Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17 and lasts for forty days. Lent is an annual opportunity for us to turn our hearts toward God, who is always turned toward us. The Lenten disciplines of *prayer*, *fasting*, and *almsgiving* are guides through this movement toward God. While we may not be able to gather this Lent, we can practice the Lenten disciplines and grow in prayer and faith.

CHANGE TO THE ROMAN MISSAL

The *Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops* has advised that following a request from the *Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments* a change will be made to the conclusion of prayers at Mass and in the celebration of the Sacraments. As of Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 the word "one" is to be omitted from the conclusion of the Collect, and likewise of similar prayers in the liturgy (for example, the Blessing of Water at the Easter Vigil). Instead of ending "one God for ever and ever", the Collect will now end "God for ever and ever."

Until now, the word "one" has been used in the conclusion to the Collect in both the earlier and the current English-language translations of the Roman Missal. However, in consultation with the *International Commission for English in the Liturgy*, the Bishops of English-speaking countries are in the process of deciding when and how each country will implement this change. The reason for it is to avoid possible misunderstandings about the identity of the Son within the Blessed Trinity, or even the misconception that Our Lord Jesus Christ is "one God" among others.

With this change, the English will now be consistent with the Latin text, as well as conform with translations into other European languages including French. The new wording, which amends the English-language translations of #54 of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, will be incorporated into all future editions of liturgical books approved for use in Canada.

The celebrant at liturgical celebrations will simply omit the word where needed.
