

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him.*

CATHEDRAL BASILICA REPAIR UPDATE

Over the past couple of months consultants from IRC (an institutional building consulting firm) have been conducting a comprehensive study of the roof, stone and structure of the Cathedral Basilica and attached residences. Their recommendation is the complete replacement of our roofs, necessary stone repair and structural support where needed. The Bishop has authorized the work to begin toward the end of this summer on the Cathedral Rectory. The roof, eaves and downspouts will be replaced. Heat tracing cables will be installed and stone repairs will be undertaken. In the Spring of 2016, the Cathedral Basilica's roof will be replaced together with eaves and downspouts. The project will conclude with the same work being conducted on the Bishop's residence. This work will require the installation of scaffolding around the buildings - we anticipate keeping disruptions to a minimum during this time.

Once the roof has been repaired, work can begin on repairing interior plaster and addressing the stained glass windows. Our thanks to the Bishop and Diocesan officials for their support of these projects.

CATHEDRAL IS OPEN

During the months of July and August the Cathedral Basilica will be open to receive visitors who wish to view it or who wish to take time to pray. We will open from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Greeters will be available in the Cathedral to assist those who are visiting and to answer questions about the Cathedral Basilica.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION FOR CHILDREN

IOHN 6

Next Sunday - the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time we will begin hearing from the entire 6th Chapter of John's Gospel. This might seem like an interruption of the cycle of passages from Mark's Gospel, but it

fits quite naturally after the feeding of the large crowd which we hear as today's Gospel passage. We will notice that in Mark's Gospel Jesus is on the move proclaiming the Kingdom in various towns and villages. For these weeks of John 6 the setting is one place - Capernaum. Here Jesus proclaims, "I am the bread of life." statement astonishes the crowds who know Jesus and his family ... how can he say such things? Here Jesus doesn't speak in a symbolic way ... he drives his point even further, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6.41-51). Many who hear him speak this way, even some of his own followers, find it too much and begin to walk away. Jesus turns to his closest collaborators and asks, "Do you also want to leave?" We see that it is Peter who responds ... "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God" (John 6.60-69). Over these next several weeks as we are led to this important profession of faith by Peter - we are called to reflect on the Lord's Real Presence in the Eucharist we share. He is our true Bread of Life broken and shared for our salvation. privilege for us to attend Mass each Sunday, to hear the Good News and to share in the Eucharist. May these days lead us to make an offering of thanksgiving to the Lord in return for his goodness to us.

May these reflections help us all grow in our faith and in our love for the Mass!
